There needs to be a publisher reform to champion textbook affordability. What is Books+? How is it charged? How to move forward? Books+ was designed with Follett to provide rental access books and materials (3 years) at a reduced rate to SBCCD and free to students. SBCCD used federal money to put towards the cost of \$7.5 million per year. Students were to return non-consumables. What changed? Funding is gone. The district spent over \$22 million. The solution – to negotiate with Follett for a fee charged to the student of \$25 per credit, which was negotiated to \$22 then to \$20. Currently, students get to decide to participate or not opt in. If a student does opt-in they pay \$20 per credit to obtain a low cost textbook. • What can we do? First, provide more online sources-OER. Fourth, have faculty select cheaper textbooks. Fifth, write our own textbook and provide digital access to students.	

		 Student Trustee Martnez – Textbook affordability is a huge issue with students. The Cal Grant is not sufficient. The cost of living has increased, and students cannot afford books.
