Tackling bylaws is a significant challenge, and while it's not a popular task, we need to support our leadership as we navigate these responsibilities and strive for improvement. AS President, Andrea Hecht  Thanked everyone and continued the discussion on recent events within the Academic Senate, proposing improvements for interactions. Expressed a commitment to learning alongside students and emphasized the importance of supporting one another to fulfill the college mission.

- Andrea highlighted the need to model respectful behavior in all forms of communication, acknowledging that words can significantly impact others. She called for clarification of the bylaws, particularly regarding the redistribution of reassigned time, noting that many members seemed unclear about the governing documents.
- She stressed the importance of understanding quorum and indicated that the bylaws are accessible on the Academic Senate webpage. Andrea pointed out that the bylaws have been out of compliance and planned to address this issue in upcoming meetings.
- Andrea discussed the redistribution of her reassigned time to support the
  Academic Senate VP, as the new bylaws required more responsibilities from
  the vice president without additional time. She will seek support from the
  Senate on this matter and encourage constructive discussions in future
  meetings.

After President Hecht's report, discussion started about bylaws on Senate Website

- Davina Burns-Peters
  - Sought clarification on the current bylaws, noting that the website still displays the old bylaws and the new ones passed in the spring have not been updated. She emphasized the need to ensure that the posted bylaws reflect what was officially approved by the Senate before further discussions.
  - Additionally, she suggested that the executive committee should address the importance of compliance with certain bylaws, particularly those with significant versus long-term impacts on the Senate and future leadership. Finally, they called for a review and codification of the new bylaws, particularly regarding the three standing committees, before using them to guide important decisions.
- Jamie Salver
  - Mentioned that she had been told the online bylaws were current, and they requested updated versions if that was not the case.
- Thomas Berry
  - Clarified that the bylaws online are current but only include those addressed last semester, leading to some discrepancies.
- Ultimately, the group confirmed that the posted bylaws are indeed current.
- 4.2. AS Vice President, Tatiana Vasquez
  - Addressed the Senate to clarify the topic of resolutions, which she had previously introduced on September 4. She noted that some members seemed



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unsure about the subject, so she aimed to explain the purpose and importance of resolutions within the Senate. PowerPoint

#### 4.3. Campus Committees

- Thomas Berry curriculum update and the courses that will start the common course numbering (AB 1111) and what courses will be going through round 1 (25 courses).
  - Tatiana Vasquez When you say Common Core numbering, what does that mean?
  - Response- This law aims to standardize course templates across community colleges to facilitate easier transfer of classes to Cal State and UC systems. By ensuring that classes follow the same template, it enhances the transferability of credits and aligns our curriculum with broader educational standards. This initiative is supported by both the Cal State and UC systems, aiming to improve student mobility and success.

  - Denise Knight shared the SBCCDTA DEIA Statement and shared the
    organization's commitment to diversity, equity, inclusion, and anti-racism,
    emphasizing their dedication to advocating for these values in a data-informed
    and equity-focused manner.
  - Jamie Salyer Provided an update on negotiations Faculty are encouraged to communicate any issues to their representatives, and the speaker also noted upcoming events, including a union luncheon and a general meeting for further discussions.

#### 4.7. Classified Senate

John Feist- expressed appreciation for the chance to speak and highlighted the need for collaboration between the Classified Senate and Academic Senate, particularly as the Classified Senate revises its bylaws. He advocated

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for increased involvement of classified professionals in committees, emphasizing their valuable insights on student issues and the importance of a shared understanding of terminology. Additionally, he noted the challenges classified staff face in participating due to not receiving reassigned time and urged for support in fostering a more inclusive environment for diverse voices in discussions  Ernest Guillen gave some insight from the CSEA perspective.  4.8. College President, Gil Contreras  Emphasized the need for support and flexibility for classified professionals to participate in participatory governance, acknowledging that heavy workloads can deter involvement. He highlighted the administration's expectation for increased reassigned time for leadership roles to facilitate this participation. Dr.
Contreras expressed gratitude for the patience and dedication shown by faculty and staff during the college's reopening from the fire and announced an
