OUR ROLE

The Academic Senate primary purpose is to ensure that faculty have a voice in the governance and decision-making processes of the district, especially on all matters related to curriculum and academic standards. It ensures faculty involvement in decision-making processes, particularly in areas outlined in the "Ten Plus One," a set of guidelines detailed in Title 5.



ELIMINATE BARRIERS TO STUDENT ACCESS AND SUCCESS

In addition to my Academic Senate President duties, I also serve on the SBVC AB 928 Task Force alongside colleagues Janice Wilkins (Articulation Officer) and Jamie Salyer (Counselor) to facilitate the critical transition to Cal-GETC, which will replace both IGETC and CSU GE patterns effective Fall 2025. Our team's work directly addresses the elimination of barriers to student access and success (a key 10+1 academic and professional matter) by:

- 1. Developing streamlined general education requirements that will create a single, clear transfer pathway for students pursuing either CSU or UC transfer
- 2. Leading comprehensive training and implementation efforts, including coordinating with over 70 counselors to ensure consistent student guidance
- 3. Creating new GE forms and protocols that will simplify the transfer process and reduce confusion among students and staff
- 4. Presenting regular updates to both Academic Senate and counseling meetings to maintain transparent communication and gather feedback

Our task force has demonstrated strong collaborative leadership in preparing for this significant change, as evidenced by the mandatory Cal-GETC Workshop scheduled on October 22, 2024. This workshop represents our commitment to ensuring all counselors and evaluators are thoroughly prepared to support students through this transition, reflecting our dedication to both professional development and student success.
