1. Approval of September 18, 2024 Minutes.	Freddy Jones moved; Pavel Bratulin seconded. Minutes passed as written.						
2. Review of Professor Vasquez's Notes	Professor Vasquez's notes were sent earlier for all to review. Several good points were brought out from these notes and discussed such as OER/ZTC courses, enhance communication to faculty and students, a dedicated website for this program and textbook cost agreements with publishers not honored by BookSaver.						

3. BookSaver Update – Dr. Rosas	Spring Priority Registration begins November 4 with students able to Opt In or Opt Out of the BookSaver Program up until the day before Census and three weeks after Census for the late start courses.	
	Jon asked if students could reverse their decision any time. Dr. Rosas responded they can Opt In or Opt Out any time up until the day before Census and three weeks after Census for the late start classes, but then they are locked in for the semester. The FAQ's need to have deadlines clearly stated and they need to be informed they need to return physical books so timely communication is necessary. Students will now have the option to Opt In or Opt Out whereas before all were opted in and they had to go to A&R to Opt Out. They will have the information before they register and can choose.	FAQ's are in the process of being revised to be clear and concise for students so they are well informed. FAQ's will be updated and near completion by the next meeting on October 15.
	Jessica reported the Bookstore is requesting booklists and they are still waiting for the import from the campus, but no book information is available yet. October 18 is the due date for book requests from the faculty.	Jessica will reach out to Andy Chang for information on getting booklists imported into their system.
	Pavel asked if the auto Opt In is being changed since Marketing needs to make changes to their communications with students. Dr. Rosas said it is being changed.	Pavel will change all of their messaging to reflect this.
	Jon stated everyone is opted in now through Follett. If this changes to Opt In or Opt Out, it may change the pricing structure from \$20 per unit. The plan is not to change the cost, and this will come from Emily Porter working through the District contract.	
	Freddy said the only students he has spoken to that are benefiting from this program are the STEM students since their books are very expensive.	
	Dr. Rosas mentioned they are working on an authorization form students can complete, allowing funds to be used from their Financial Aid award to pay for their books. It will explain what the fees are for, and the students can authorize payment for their books.	The authorization form will be in place for spring semester. Dr. Rosas will make sure this form is ready to go. She will check with the technical team to see if a link can be inserted into the FAQ's students can click on to complete the form.

Jessica reported that students were upset by the BookSaver Program and how it was not accessible for them if all their fees were not paid. Ricardo said in talking with the ASG students, some of the clinical and lab materials were not covered by the BookSaver Program for nursing students and just the books were paid for. It does not help some of the special programs.	This issue will be brought before the main Task Force group for discussion by Dr. Rosas.
Nelva shared students can get some used books through Amazon cheaper than the \$20 per unit fee. STEM students can save money on this program, but other students cannot.
