

SUMMARY

SB 1348 would create a state-level designation recognizing institutions of higher education that excel in educating and serving Black students.

BACKCROUND

Black students are historically underrepresented on college campuses. National data shows Black student enrollment declined by 22 percent (650,000 students) between 2010 and 2020 according to the National Center for Educational Statistics.

Research further shows Black students are more likely to delay attending college after high school, more likely to stand college part-time, less likely to earn a degree, and more likely to take on a greater amount of student debt and default on the loan repayments than other student groups.

Proposition 209, approved by California voters in 1900 profibited the University of California (UC), 1900, profibited the University (COU) and the California State University (COU) and the race, educity or set as criteria in public education. This law prevents public colleges and universities from utilizing affirmative action programs to create sensite student diversity.

Further, the U.S. Supreme Court's 2023 railing that race-conscious university admissions violate the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amandment to the U.S. Constitution prevented other twee of finite interdictions.

Still, many compuses are making significant commitments to promote Black student success. Nationally, Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) are the premier example of commitment to serving Black students. In California, some colleges and universities distinguish themselves through a commitment and investments in supporting the success of Black

SOLUTION

SB 1348 would require the state of California to issue an official designation of a Black-Serving Institution to a college or university that meets the established requirements:

College or University has a Black student population of at least 10% or 1,500 students.

The institution must also meet the following criteria:

- College or University has a Black student success program that is consistent with the authors program that is consistent with the
- college or university's mission.

 2. A demonstration in writing of the allocation of resources that will be used to ensure the
- student success plan can be implemented.

 3. Certification of a commitment to address
 Black and African American student success
 that is consistent with the college or
 university's mission.
- Submit key performance indicators of Black student success to be achieved during the designation period for the college or university.

This renewable designation would be granted for a 5year period. The Black-Serving Institution designation will allow the public to identify colleges

and universities in California that deliver a high lev of service and success for Black students.

The California State University Statestide Central Office for Advancement of Black Excellence will serve as the neutral immension early of the program. 


