	We are transitioning to the compressed calendar in August and will begin August 25. It will be a little different and is a 16-week compressed calendar. Department Chairs will have to re-do some of their calculations for the class meeting times. Rania added this does not affect in-service or flex days and there is no winter session. 3. Mid-Term Report – Dr. Humble	The mid-term report has been approved by the Academic Senate, Accreditation Committee and will go to College Council and will be board approved this week. 4. Starfish CRM Update – K. Heilgeist (Tentative)	Kristina reported Outreach used virtual kiosks for prospective students with a QR code they took to the high schools. We can actually give students a Starfish account before they apply to college. With this code they are able to track if and when they apply to college and gives the ability to communicate with potential students before they apply. Then, if and when they apply, it will merge their student record with that contact card and we are able to track better. We can also identify, through Starfish, Priority Registration groups and can send out flyers to each group 1-3 days before their priority registration begins, they will get an associated text message, and a reminder is added to their student calendar. The system automatically sends a message if the student has not registered yet.	

	This was first piloted in Spring 2024, and we are seeing an increase in students registering. Automated flags have increased from 40 courses in spring to 350 courses in the fall semester, so we are seeing growth. Flags are for inactivity, missing assignments, low grades, etc. as per the instructor's parameters.	If there are faculty interested in the automated flags, they can contact Kristina Heilgeist. Starfish Progress Survey Open Lab on October 14 in LIB 109 from 9-11:00am.
5. Other Updates – All	Dr. Oxendine reported on drop reasons and her follow up with TESS. Even with the new Self Service, we are limited to 25 characters or less and this was the hold-up for this past fall. We have worked to take the original reasons and condensed them now to 25 characters or less without losing the meanings that we need to try and better understand why the students are dropping classes. In Spring 2025 with these revised reasons, they will be input into Self Service, and we will be able to begin using them. Our data will be more accurate so we can better support our students. Keenan shared a flyer for Spring 2025 registration with block parties and enrollment labs. April reported they are working to get summer and fall applications open to high school students. Priority B block party in collaboration with athletics on Thursday and Friday, November 7 and 8. Valley Bound applications for 2025-26 will be open on November 1. Grad Fest will be held tomorrow online only from 1- 6:00 pm. Next week is the Undocumented Student Action Week. Veteran's Day Festival is November 12.
